

## Wine tasting in Repnice

One of the most exciting, but relatively unknown sights of Slovenia are the wine cellars in Bizeljsko. These hand-dug quartz cellars are a unique sight and one of the must-see highlights of the region. In remnants of the Pannonian Sea in the form of a thick layer of quartz stone, the locals dug cellar caves. This natural cellares was used for storing crops, mainly turnips, in Slovenian 'repa' and hence the name Repnica.

This will be a unique experience of wine tasting tpicaly for this part of Slovenia in special environment, while we will be served with homemade bread, cold cuts and the typical local dish Bizeljski kolač



We will start our wine adventure by a meeting at the Terme Čatež bus station. By bus we will cross the longest river in Slovenia, the Sava river, drive through the forest Dobrava, and enter the Bizeljsko-Sremič wine road. Place that is surrounded by hills full of vineyards on one side, and ends on the other side with the river Sotla, which forms the border between Croatia and Slovenia can fascinate us with view typical for this part of Slovenia.
